3	WHEREAS, the General Conference of the past four five quadrennia has affirmed the Rural
4	Chaplains Association and the ministries of rural chaplains, and called on The United Methodist
5	Church to prepare and certify rural chaplains as a significant means of enabling renewal in
6	towns/villages and rural churches and communities globally; and
7	WHEREAS, the Rural Chaplains Association has women, men, laity and clergy members,
8	both United Methodist and ecumenical, in the global community; and
9	WHEREAS, rural chaplains are lay and clergy persons who have sensed the call to live in,
10	work with, and advocate for town and rural persons, families, congregations and communities;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, special emphasis is placed on advocacy for justice issues among all people,
13	regardless of ethnicity, gender, age or economic status; and
14	WHEREAS, rural chaplains meet annually for support, encouragement, networking,
15	resourcing, and support enrichment by means of focus events to enrich person-related
16	chaplaincy-type skills, biblical understandings and experiential exposures related to issues such
17	as immigration, migrant workers, farm workers, rural businesses and communities; and
18	WHEREAS, rural chaplains work with other prophetic persons/groups on the local level who
19	are committed to long-term involvement aimed at developing local and outside resources to
20	assist with transformation of the lives of rural congregations and communities; and
